

A circular trail linking the **Brañas do Sar** area with **Parque Eugenio Granell** (park). Due to its proximity to the city centre throughout the route, you can access the trail from almost any point and leave it at any time.

If you want to make the route shorter, we recommend Trail 05. River Sar > Muíño de Parceiros.

We suggest starting at **Colegiata Santa María a Real do Sar**, a 12th-century collegiate church on the banks of the River Sar, which, along with the Cathedral, is the church that best reflects its original Romanesque style. From there we head towards **Ponte do Sar** (bridge) and, without crossing it, we turn right to start our way down, parallel to the river (which is on our left).

When the stonewall ends, at the fork, we should follow the trail on the right, which continues straight on as far as the **Fonte das Brañas do Sar** fountain and, from there, to the **Huertos Urbanos Municipales** (vegetable plots). Continuing under the A Ponte Pedriña roundabout, we enter **Parque Eugenio Granell** (park) and the trail runs parallel to the river as far as **Muíño de Parceiros** (waterwheel). From there, the trail continues straight ahead as far as **Fonte and Lavadoiro de Pereda de Abaixo** (fountain and washing place), which mark the entrance of the railway tunnel, where we can see the sign for the **Carballo de Conxo** oak tree. At the other end of the tunnel, the trail follows the asphalted track and, after passing among the houses, it becomes a very narrow path between two walls. On reaching the asphalted track, we should turn left and go down towards the bridge over the river, where we find the entrance to **Bosque do Banquete de Conxo** (woodland). There, another sign leads us to the **Carballo de Conxo**, a 250-year-old oak that was named the Best Spanish Tree in 2022. Further on we come across a mural depicting the **Banquete de Conxo**, which was a banquet that brought together, around the same table, university students, workers, and artisans on March 2, 1856, as a show of equality, being considered one of the foundational events of Galician nationalism.

The trail continues by crossing the stonewall and following the course of the river, which it accompanies as far as the **Ponte do Monte** bridge. We then cross the bridge and turn left to arrive, after 100m, at the **Fervenza de Conxo** waterwall. To return to the Banquete de Conxo area, we just have to follow the path ahead of us and, after reaching the asphalted track, go back via Rúa Suarribas, turning right along the narrow passageway between the fields.

The trail continues as far as the Muíño de Parceiros waterwheel before going through **Carballeira do Paxonal** (oak grove) and Parque Eugenio Granell (park), with the river now on our left. On reaching the statue of **José Martí** (which is located close to the wooden cafeteria), the trail crosses the bridge and brings us back to the path going under the A Ponte Pedriña roundabout. At the Huertos Urbanos Municipales, the trail turns right, crosses the river and continues along Carreiro de Picaños for around 550m before reaching several houses, where it turns left as far as the stonewall that leads us back to **Ponte do Sar**. Once we reach the bridge, we can turn left to come to **Colegiata Santa María a Real do Sar** again. If we want to extend our walk a little further, we can cross straight ahead and continue for around 900m (one way) to reach the end of this riverside trail at the municipal swimming pool.

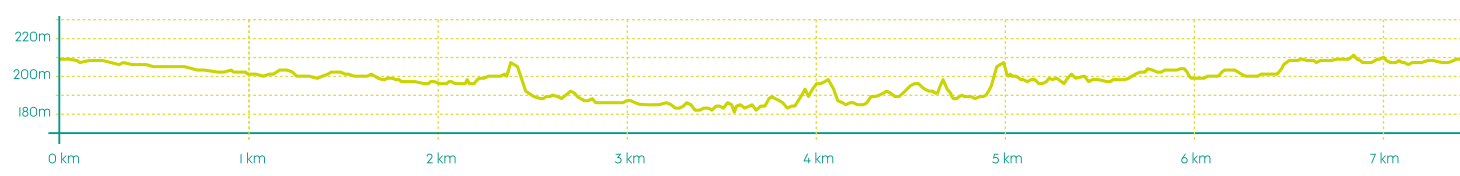
